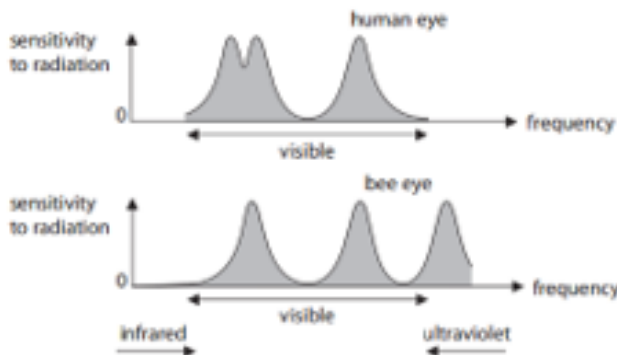

— Dmitri Mendeleev**

Dmitri Ivanovich Mendeleev 8 February 1834 – 2 February 1907 was a Russian chemist and inventor. He formulated the Periodic Law, created a farsighted version of the periodic table of elements, and used it to correct the properties of some already discovered elements and also to predict the properties of eight elements yet to be discovered.

Elements known at that time

In 1869, Mendeleev classified the then known 56 elements on the basis of their physical and chemical properties in the increasing order of the atomic

masses, in the form of a table. Mendeleev had observed that properties of the elements orderly recur in a cyclic fashion. He found that the elements with similar

properties recur at regular intervals when the elements are arranged in the order of their increasing atomic masses. He concluded that the physical and

chemical properties of the elements are periodic functions of their atomic masses. This came to be known as the law of chemical periodicity.



Significance of classification of Elements -

- 1. Easy study of elements:** Classification of elements in groups provide us with a fixed pattern in which the elements change their properties periodically. Periodic table made the study of physical and chemical properties of elements simple and organized. We can now just go to the group and see the properties of the elements of the periodic table or predict the properties of an element if we know the characteristics of other elements present in the same group.
- 2. Helps in discovering new elements**

Although there are so many elements which are already discovered, there are chances that new elements can be discovered. Scientists can take the help of periodic table and know the trending characteristics based on the properties of elements and hence can identify the new elements with the existing ones. Besides, researchers are continuously striving to discover new elements and explore their properties.



Doberceiner's Attempt

Johann Wolfgang Doberceiner (13 December 1780 – 24 March 1849) was a German chemist who is best known for work that foreshadowed the periodic law for the chemical elements and inventing the first lighter, which was known as the Doberceiner's lamp.

Doberceiner's attempt at classification of elements are generally considered the first recorded attempt. He **identified elements with similar properties and grouped them into groups of three, hence the name "triads"**. He realized when you arrange these three elements according to their atomic mass, the atomic mass of the second element was

roughly the average of the atomic masses of the first and third element.



Doberceiner had clubbed Lithium (Li), Sodium (Na) and Potassium (K) together in a triad. The atomic masses of Li and K are 6.9 and 39. And the atomic weight of Na is in fact 23 which is very close to the average of the other two. However, Doberceiner soon found out that this was not uniform across all elements, and so this

system had very short-lived and limited success.

Advantage of classification:
It helps other chemists look at elements in terms of groups of elements with similar chemical properties which led to vigorous classification of elements.

- Doberceiner's classification was not uniform across all elements.
- He classified only 49 elements into 6 groups of 3 elements.
- Today scientists generally arrange elements across their atomic mass.

Newland's Attempt

John Alexander Reina Newlands (26 November 1837 – 29 July 1898) was a British chemist who worked concerning the periodicity of elements.

Will you believe that chemistry and music have a connection? That's right. An English scientist, John Newlands tried to classify the elements in a unique manner. He first started by arranging all the elements in a ascending order according to their atomic weights. Hydrogen being the lightest was obviously first. And at that time only **56 elements were known**, the last one being thorium. After arranging the elements so, Newland discovered that **the first and the eight elements showed similar properties and characteristics**. He compared this to the eight octaves of music (do, re, mi, fa, sol, la, si, do) where every eighth note is similar to the first. Hence this classification came to be known as Newland's Law of Octaves.

However, there were a number of faults with the classification. First, the law was **only applicable up till Calcium**. After calcium, every eighth element did not share similar properties to the first one.

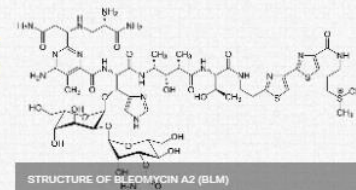

Metals in diagnosis

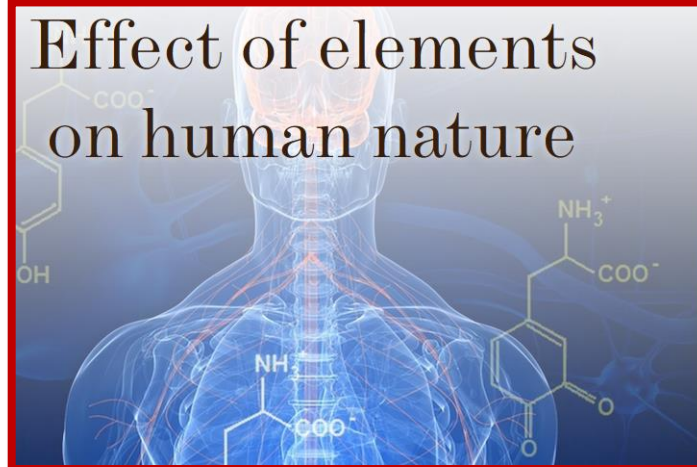
Metal ions are often used for diagnostic medical imaging. Metal complexes can be used either for radioactive imaging or as contrast agents, for example, in Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI). Such imaging can be enhanced by manipulation of the ligands in a complex to create specificity so that the complex will be taken up by a certain cell or organ type.



EXAMPLES:

- Technetium 99m[Tc]: It is the most commonly used radioactive agent for imaging purposes.
- Gadolinium(III), Iron(III), Manganese(II): These are paramagnetic metals used for MRI.
- Gallium-68: It is useful as a positron source for Positron Emission Tomography.
- Cobalt(III): It is used with BLM to selectively be taken up by tumor cells.

- ⇒ Creating an account on LinkedIn and Twitter to reach out to anybody and everybody and to widen their network.

• CAREER DNA

- ⇒ Defining their key responsibility areas and key performance indicators. While KRAs follow directly from the job description of an employee, KPIs document the specific area in which an employee is expected to work.

- ⇒ Building a profile defining their skill set and experience in a particular field.

- ⇒ For example, if a person wants to become an HR Manager-

- ⇒ KRAs would include – Recruitment, Training and Development etc.

- ⇒ KPIs would include – Average number of training hours per employee etc.

• LIST THE AREAS OF INTEREST

- ⇒ Prioritizing their areas of interest to get a better idea of what career they want to pursue further.

- ⇒ Applying for online courses in the field they are interested in.

- ⇒ Many courses are available at Udemy, Coursera etc.

• INTERN, INTERN AND INTERN

- ⇒ Internship is important to get an experience of the field they are getting into.

- ⇒ Through LinkedIn, connect with people who can help them get a job at the company they want to work in.
