The interactors showed how the online classes were conducted with the earnest efforts put in by the teachers. The trials and tribulations of a teacher's journey during the Pandemic were explored.




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
ENTERTAINMENT FOR AWARENESS

Rotaract District 3012 even posted a special appreciation post for BBPSRH Interact Club for their amazing contribution to this project.






DIWALI DONATION

The campaign was even appreciated by the Rotaract District 3012 via comments on the Instagram post.






BOOKS' DONATION DRIVE






SUN TO LOH CAMPAIGN
