

Poor menstrual hygiene management has been shown to result in a sense of shame, anxiety, and embarrassment that contributes to absenteeism and poor performance at school. The objectives of this policy are to address the stigma and hygiene around menstruation.

In the current situation, early 8.8% of children from the secondary department in the urban Delhi-NCR region are dropouts. In comparison, 5 per cent of the same age group has never been enrolled in any school, according to UDISE+ 2020-2021 Report. Out of which 9.9% of the figure are responsible for girl child dropouts—a study conducted on reasons for drop-out points to the poor facilities around sanitation and menstruation at schools.
