Sub: Guidelines of Examination and Promotion for Classes III to VIII w.e.f. Academic Session 2023-24

As per section 16 (1), "There shall be a regular examination in the fifth class and in the eighth class at the end of every academic year".

Assessment of classes III, IV, VI & VII will be done on the same examination pattern as of classes V & VIII and the students of classes third, fourth, sixth and seventh will not be held back in the same class.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

No child will be expelled from a school till the completion of "Elementary Education"

Assessment of Classes III & IV will be done on the same examination pattern as of class V

The students of classes III and IV will not be held back in the same class.

Fraction of the marks will be rounded of as per mathematical formula: For Example: 8.1 to 8.4 are rounded of 8.0 and 8.5 to 8.9 is rounded of 9.0 in all the subjects and classes.

The assessment and evaluation during the academic session will be done in two terms as given below.

Term I: April 2023- September 2023

Term II: October 2023 - March 2024

CLASSES I-II

(The policy to be followed in classes I and II is based on RTE Act-2009, Chapter-5, Section-29 h says: Comprehensive and continuous evaluation of child's understanding of knowledge and his/her ability to apply the same.)

- Students will be assessed on the basis of classroom performance that includes assignments, observation, class response, project work, activities, discussions, participation etc.
- The students will also be assessed on the basis of their performance in co-scholastic areas (Art, Good Reading, Dance, Music, Sports activities, GK & Computers).
- Every student must have a minimum of 75% attendance.

Co-Scholastic Assessment (Classes I - II)

This will be done on the basis of the student's performance in co-scholastic areas like Art, Good Reading, Dance, Music, Sports activities, GK & Computers.

- Students must be discouraged from missing an assessment unless on grounds of extreme emergency like a contagious disease, a fracture etc.

- **SCHOLASTIC ASSESSMENT** will include different kinds of classroom activities, projects, holidays homework etc to be assessed under following heads. These will be assessed twice in a year.
- Subject Enrichment
- Project Based Activities
- Multiple Assessment
- Portfolio

Subject Enrichment:

This will include activities based on experiential learning integrated with each subject leading to subject enrichment of the child that will connect different areas of knowledge, application and values. (Art integrated activities like quizzes, role plays, poster making, poetry etc)

Project Based Activities :

This will include activities designed to give opportunity in development of key skills like identification of problems, logical thinking, creativity. (culinary art, visual art, creating slides, creating art etc)

• Multiple Assessment:

This aims at evaluating the performance of the learner regularly using multiple and diverse techniques like observation, oral tests, individual or group work, listening and speaking skills etc.

Portfolio:

This will be a record of the achievements of the student thr<u>oughout the year for self assessment.</u> It aims to: achieve diverse curriculum outcomes of learner's effort, progress and growth assessment of performance record and documents.

Promotion Policy

Passing Criteria for Classes III - IV

Assessment of Classes III and IV will be done on the same examination pattern as of class V. However, students of Classes III and IV will not be held back in the same class.

Passing Criteria for Class V

To be declared "Pass" at the end of the session for promotion to the next higher class, a student must secure at least 33% marks in each subject studied by him/her during the session. He/she must secure overall 33% marks i.e., 33 marks out of 100.

- The promotion to the next higher class will also be subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% marks be scored in each subject in the Mid Term (20 marks) plus Annual Examination (50 marks) i.e., 18 marks out of 70 in each subject.
- A candidate not eligible to be declared "Pass" will be declared "Promoted" at the end of the session of a class provided he/she is entitled to grace marks.

- **❖ Discretionary Grace** marks up to maximum of 10 in all, shall be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required 33% of marks in each subject.
 - ➤ Provided that a minimum of 25% of marks are secured in each subject in the Mid Term plus the Annual Examination i.e., 18 marks out of 70 Marks to make him/her eligible for promotion.
 - ➤ Provided that he/she does not require more than 05 marks in one subject to come up to the minimum required of 33% of marks in that subject.

A candidate who appears in the Annual Examination can be declared eligible for appearing at the Re-Examination in all the failing subject(s). Such a candidate will be eligible to appear in the subject(s) at a subsequent examination to be held within a period of two months from the date of declaration of the result known as the "Re-Examination".

Re-Examination will be conducted on the same syllabus and pattern as of Annual Examination. Weightage of Marks obtained by the student in Re-Examination will be proportionately calculated out of 70 marks.

Marks obtained in the attendance of the student (05 marks) plus marks of Subject Enrichment (05 marks) plus marks of Project Based Activities (05) Marks) plus marks of Portfolio (05 marks) plus marks of Multiple Assessment (05 marks) plus marks of Periodic Tests/Unit Tests (05 marks) will be carried forward and added with the marks obtained by the student in the Re- Examination.

Re-Examination

To be declared "Pass" in Re-Examination, a student will have to secure at least 25% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Re-Examination i.e., 18 marks out of 70, provided that a minimum of 33 marks out of 100 marks are secured in total i.e., Marks of Re-Examination (70 marks) plus marks obtained in the internal assessment (30 marks).

No benefit of the discretionary grace marks will be given to the student appearing in Re - Examination for the promotion to the next higher class.

Criteria for Essential Repeat:

- If a student does not secure at least 25% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Re-Examination and minimum of 33 out of 100 marks in that subject(s) or does not appear in the Re-Examination, he/she will be placed in the category of "Essential Repeat" (ER).
- A student of Class V who is not eligible for Pass, Promotion and placed in the category of "Essential Repeat" (ER) will be held back in the same class during the next session.

USE OF UNFAIR MEANS

- Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students using unfair means.
- The answer scripts of students using unfair means will be cancelled and a new answer script will be issued.
- Only the new answer script will be assessed.
- Repeated unfair means will invite major penalization.
