Regardless, the reader can appreciate the uniqueness of the work.

Despite the wide range of emotions and reactions that come with studying poetry, it can be a rewarding pursuit. Not only does reading poetry allow one to appreciate the artistic beauty of the written word but also enables one to develop crucial critical thinking and analytical skills. SUMMER ASSIGNMENT (SCIENCE)

<u>AIL PROJECT:</u> Title: Investigating Sustainable Development in Lakshadweep, Andaman and Nicobar Islands and represent the same through PPT.

Objectives:

- To understand the scientific concepts of sustainability and natural resource management
- To use scientific inquiry to investigate the natural resources and ecosystem of Lakshadweep, Andaman and Nicobar Islands
- To evaluate the impact of human activities on the environment and natural resources

To propose scientifically informed solutions for sustainable development and management of natural resources in Lakshadweep, Andaman and Nicobar Islands

Tasks for the students:

Research-The students will conduct scientific research on the biodiversity of the region including flora, fauna and marine life and ecological processes that sustain it.

Data Collection: The students will collect data on the region its natural resources and environment through fieldwork, interviews, and surveys. They

will analyse the data using scientific methods and tools such as statistical analysis, GIS mapping and remote sensing.

Analysis: The students will analyse the impact of human activities on the environment and natural resources using scientific methods. They will evaluate the data collected and use scientific reasoning to identify the challenges faced by the region in sustainable development and management of natural resources.

Solutions: The students will propose scientifically informed solutions for sustainable development and management of natural resources in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. They will consider the scientific principles of ecological balance, conservation biology, and ecosystem services to suggest ways to balance economic development with conservation. They will also evaluate the feasibility and potential impact of their proposed solutions.

Presentation: The students will prepare a scientific report and a PowerPoint presentation to showcase their research, data analysis, and proposed solutions. They will present their findings and recommendations to the class and receive feedback from their peers.

The students will submit a printout of the ppt to the subject teachers.
