3. Geronimo wanted to get out of cackle fur castle but then had no choice.

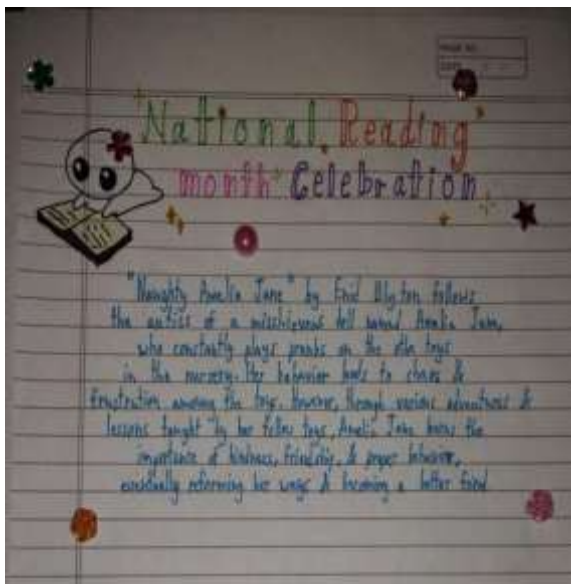
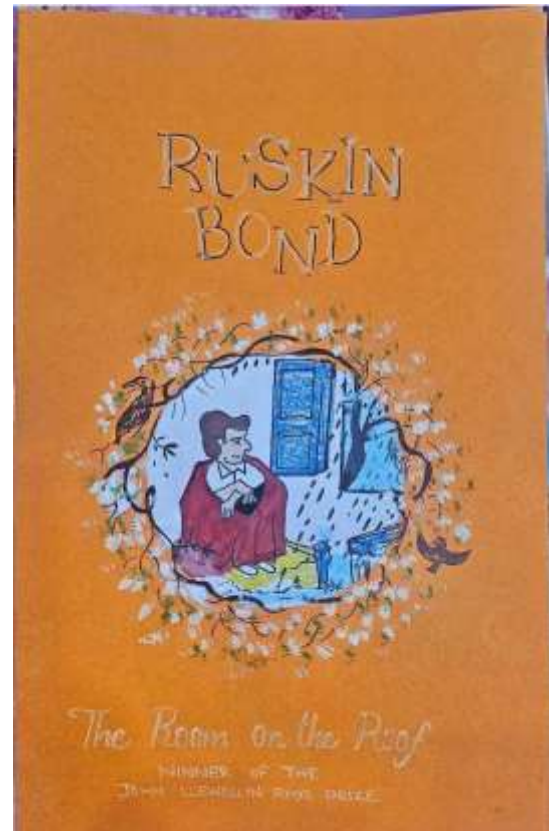
4. He met a lot of **WEIRD** people, a cook who made a stew 500 years in the same pot, a talking flower, and more.

7. Once he was almost there, he thought he got a new idea for another book.

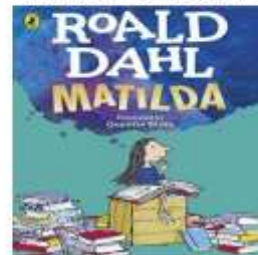
8. He wrote a new book and the **END!**
