

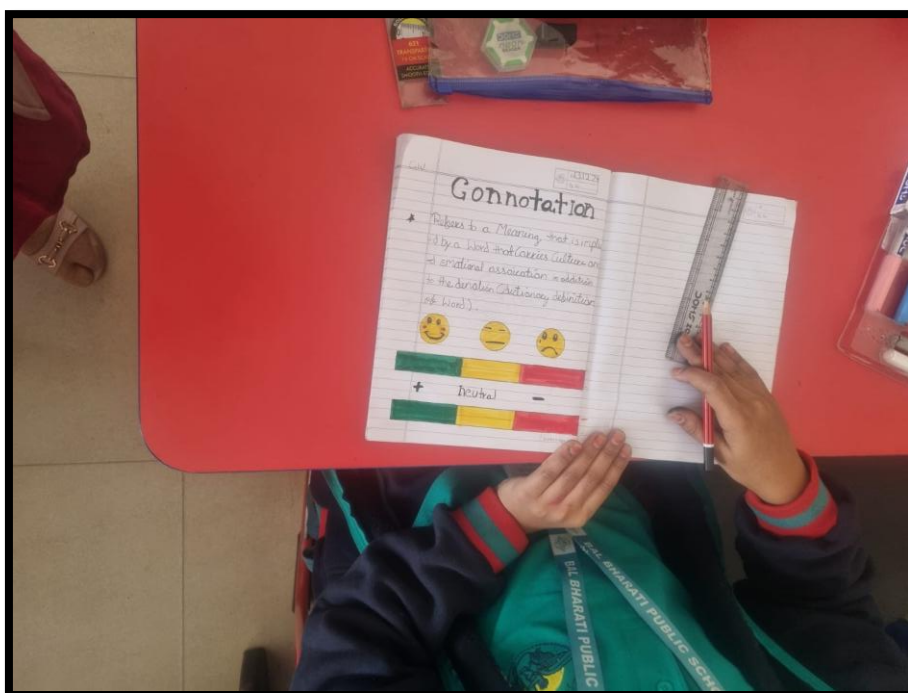

Connotation

Means a meaning that is implied by a word that is not literal and emotional associations. In addition, it includes the differing attitudes of words.

Examples

* When the manager of the store asked his employees to answer one employee gave a self-assured answer.

Smiley face	Neutral	Sad face
+	neutral	-
Confident	self-assured	conceited
inexpensive	bargain	cheap
effusive	vehement	effusive
ingratiating	cautious	neasy

Example:
When the manager asked his employees to answer a question one employee gave a confident response (confident, self-assured, conceited)
