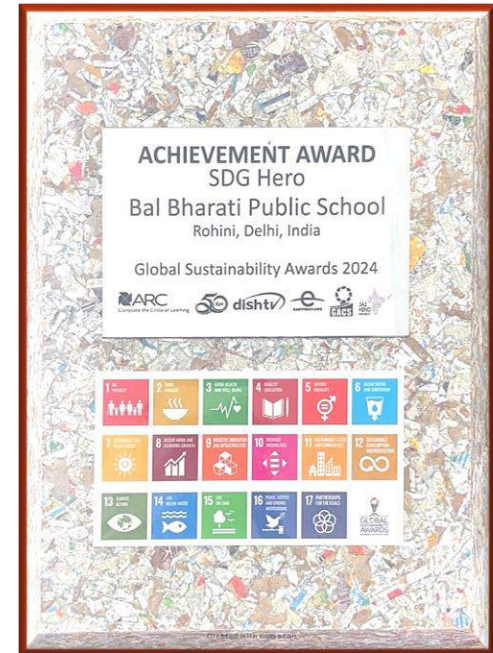
# INDIA SCHOOL MERIT AWARDS 2024

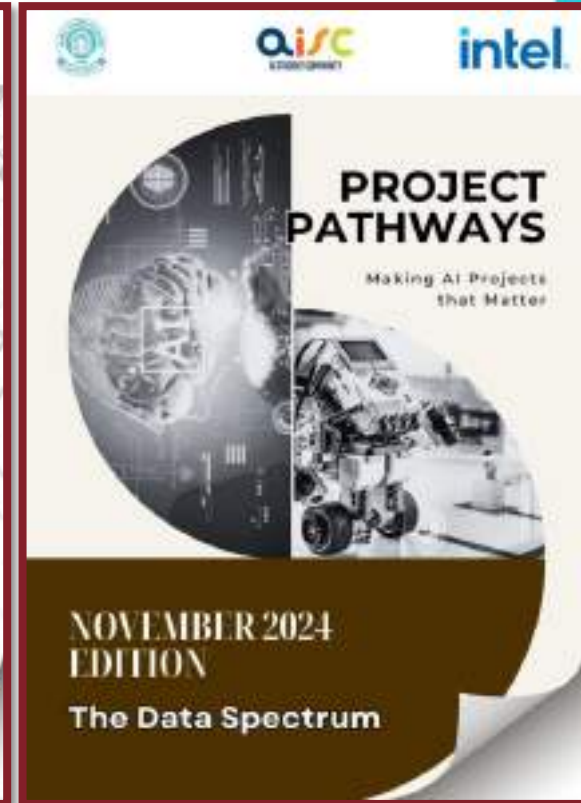

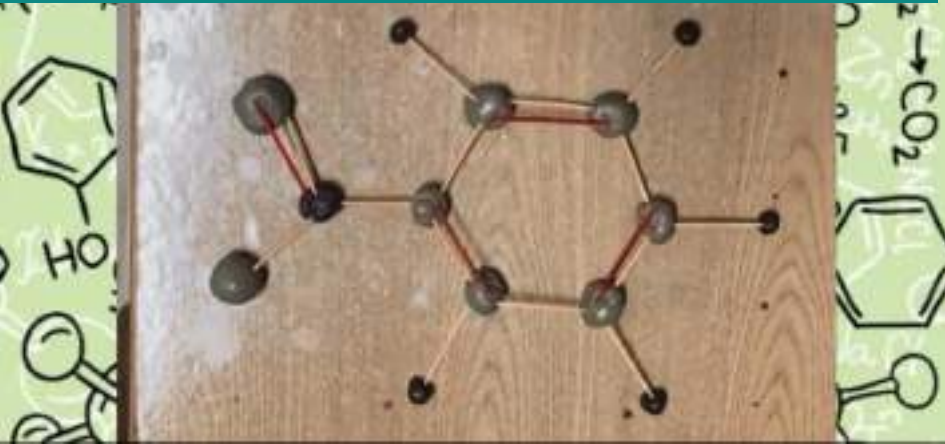
# MOLE DAY 16 November 2024

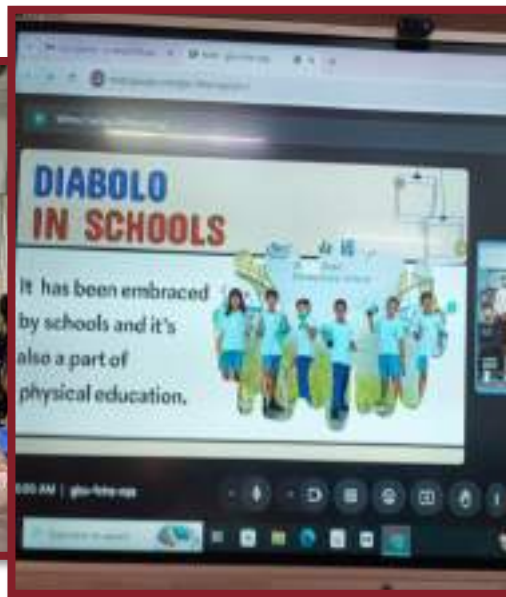
# VIRTUAL SESSION WITH PARTNER SCHOOL IN TAIWAN

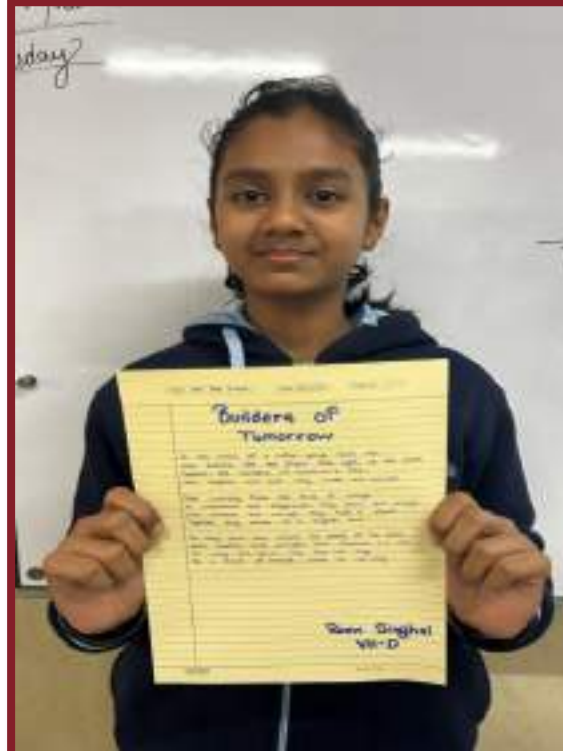
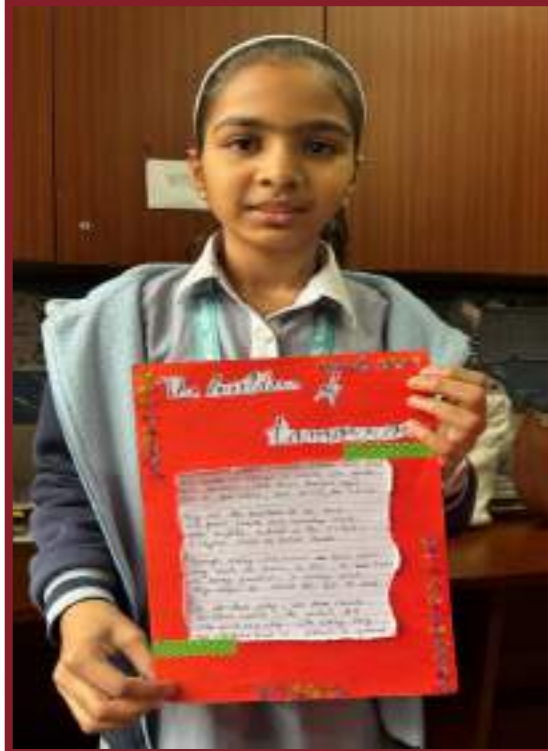

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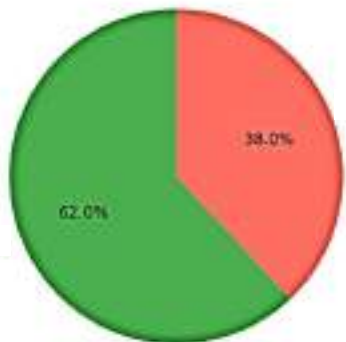
# SHORT READS PROGRAMME BY SCHOLASTIC

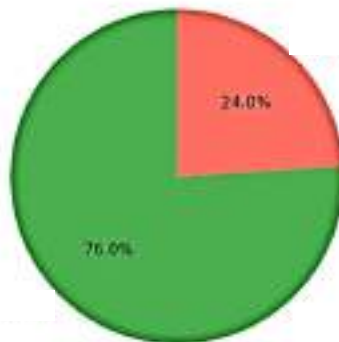

The 3rd Law: Make Reading Easy. The 4th Law: Make Reading Satisfying.

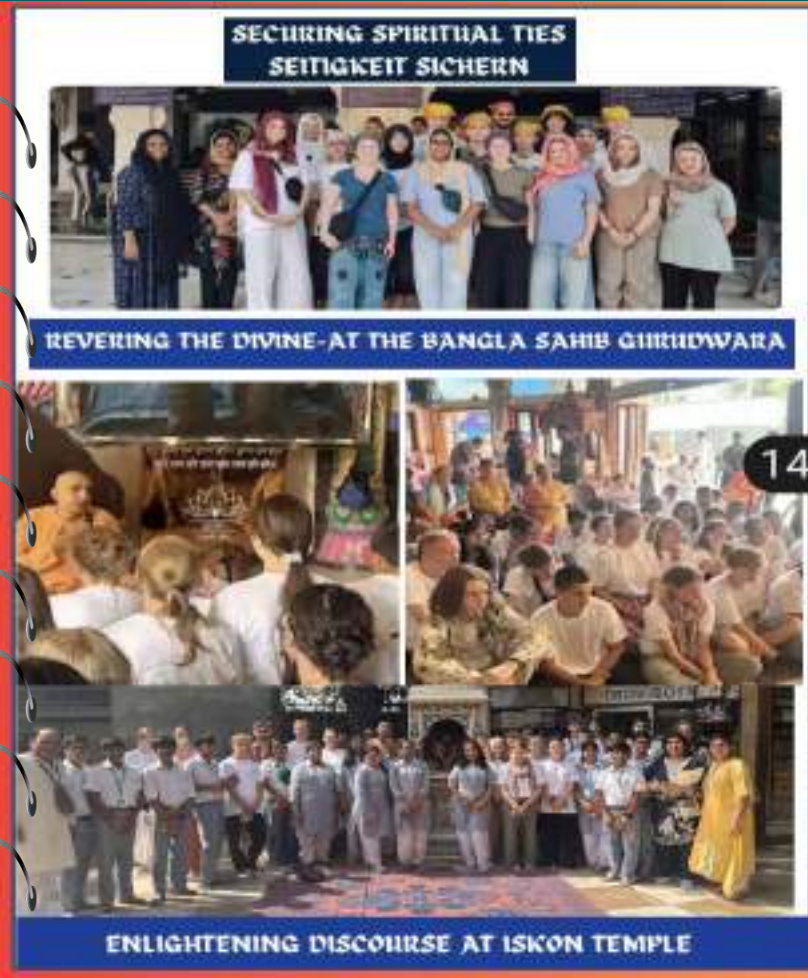

# 'NEP 2020 aims to encourage student-driven strategies for the teaching learning process'

What is your view of the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020 which was implemented last year? How would it change the school education scenario?

The NEP 2020 is a futuristic and student friendly document based on five pillars of access, equity, quality, affordability & accountability. It aims to encourage student-driven strategies for teaching learning process, while nurturing empathetic global citizens deeply rooted in Indian ethos and culture. With the NEP 2020, pedagogy will evolve into andragogy and further heutagogy, resting the onus of learning on the pupils.

**Please identify some initiatives taken by your school regarding the NEP 2020.**

At BBPS Rohini, an institution under the aegis of Child Education Society (CES), following initiatives have been undertaken: (1) Teacher empowerment for pedagogical innovations and multiple flexible assessments, (2) Eliminating SILOS through integrated projects with the real world, integration of visual & performing arts and sports with scholastic subjects, (3) Building a culture of innovation through the activities of School Innovation Cell and Entrepre-

neurship Cell. (4) Skill development programmes such as scouts & guides, AI, IT and hackathon, embroidery & pottery initiatives etc., and (5) Instilling mental well-being through structured counselling sessions, awakening modules by RK Mission, collaboration with Mokshayattan Yog Sansthan & school clubs such as Heritage and Sankriti & Sanskaar Club.

**On your vast experience, where do you think educators like you must focus their efforts to take India to the next level? What are the challenges ahead at the classroom and school levels and what would be your priority?**

Cultivating a growth mindset and metacognitive skills among the stake-

holders is a herculean task. Integrating heterogeneous students from varying communities, social strata and special needs in all school activities poses yet another challenge. I believe the most monumental task at hand is to re-humanise education in this age of machines as we strive to nurture an assiduous value system and raise gregarious global citizens.

**What are the chief strengths of school students these days? What are the areas of weaknesses that you think need to be addressed?**

Our students today are incredibly creative and innovative, expressing themselves through art, content creation, and entrepreneurship. However, we need to focus on developing their interpersonal skills. While the students are highly connected online, strengthening face-to-face communication, including active listening and expression of speech, is crucial. As a responsible community, we must pay more attention on filling in their deficit of soft skills with special consideration to nurturing tolerance, gratitude, empathy and resistance to negative pressures. Ultimately, our role as educators is to help them balance these strengths and develop skills for a thriving future.

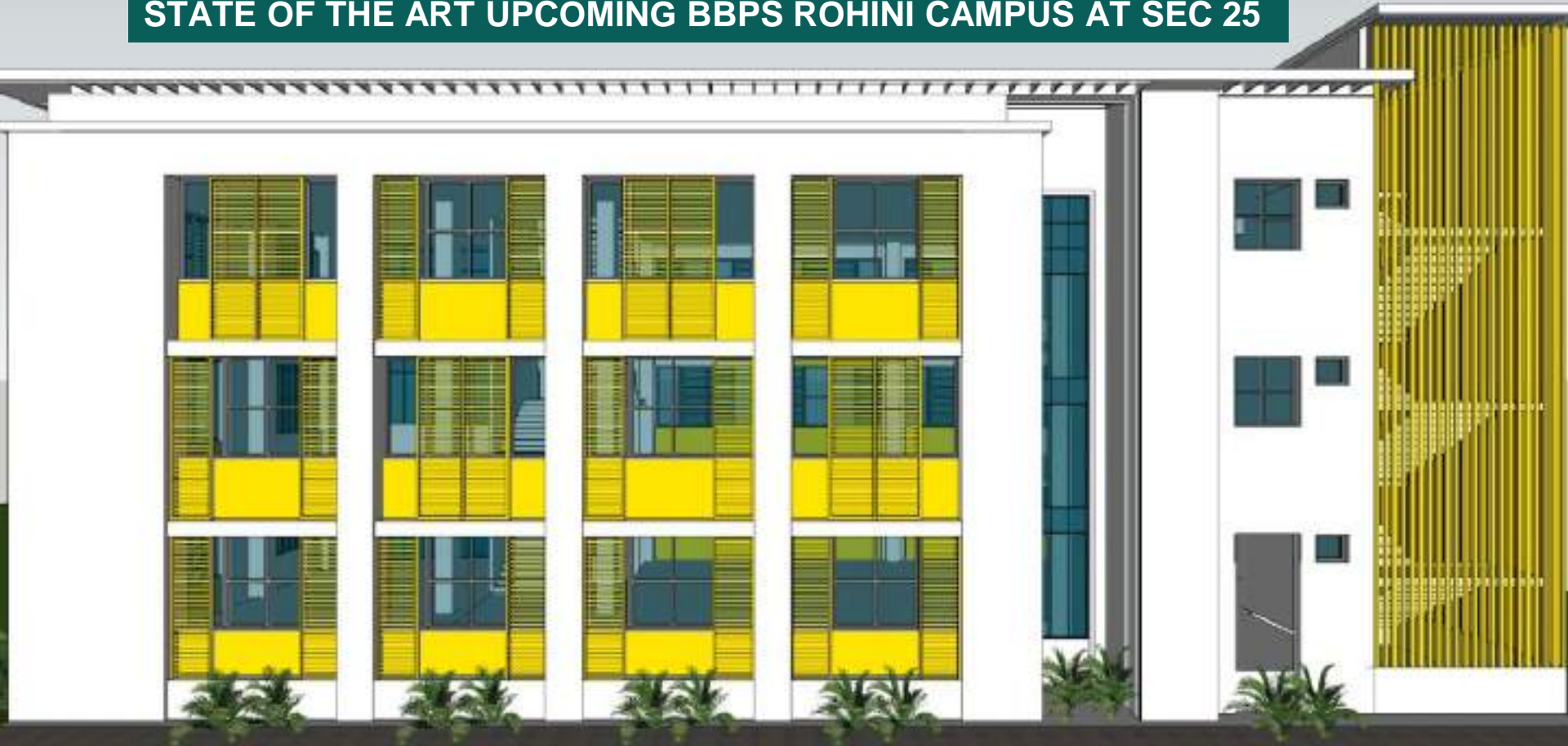
